Watchmaker's Tips

I have never felt comfortable using those hand-held balance truing calipers, so whenever I need to check or straighten a balance, I remove the hairspring and

chuck the balance in the jewelers lathe. (Please note that I never run the lathe at speed, I only use my hand to rotate the spindle.) I use a tool steady and a 10X loupe to test for run-out the same way you would test a bicycle rim, gently applying pressure with tweezers where

necessary. If I have a balance wheel that has been badly bent, I will try to get the rim concentric first, then remove any up/down play. Its worth the extra effort to get a balance wheel just right because any slight imperfection is *very* noticeable while the watch is running.☺

Provenance Matters

The history of ownership of a clock or watch can be extremely important to a future buyer of your clocks or watches, whether you or your estate is selling the items. The previous owner or owners, the date you purchased the item and its cost are important things to know when it's time to sell. Also include any exhibits your timepiece has been in and any articles or books it might be mentioned in. A history of repairs and restorations and who performed those repairs or restorations can also be vital information. For watches, a simple filing system alphabetized by maker and subdivided by model can suffice. For clocks, it's even easier. An index card with the vital information tucked inside the door is just as effective as a filing system. I even know of many collectors who put the business card of a potential buyer inside the door of a clock.



Rare or common, expensive or inexpensive, the history of ownership of your clock or watch is simple to maintain and can pay off for you in the long run, or can make life much simpler for your heirs.☺

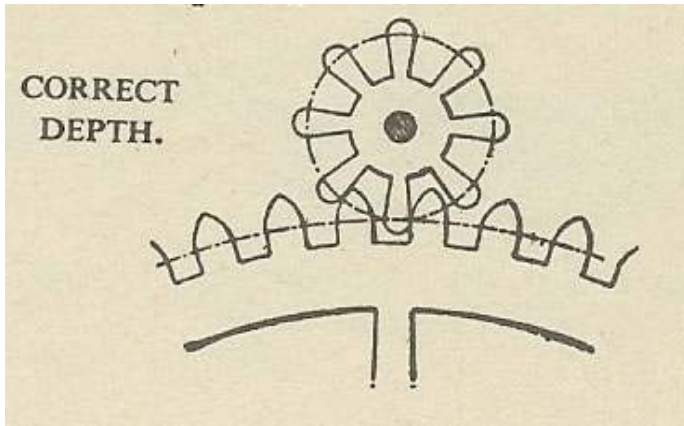

Depth. The degree of intersection between a pair of gears. The depth is said to be correct when the pitch circles of both gears meet.

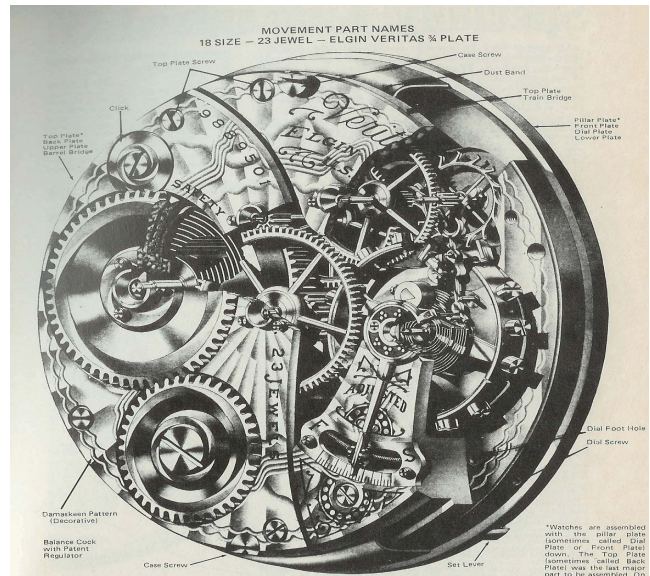
