The exhibit of pre-Civil War American clocks and watches was tremendous, and we had so many pieces we ran out of table room. Thanks very much to the exhibitors for showing such a wide variety of great timepieces. I want to especially thank Charlie Schubert, a former NAWCC Director visiting from Oregon, for his impromptu discussion of tablets and glasses in the clocks of the Exhibit. Charlie shared

his vast knowledge of the techniques of reverse painting, stenciling and lithography.

Michael discussed clock mainspring winders, showing an example of each model currently on the market and pointing out the pros and cons of each. He also demonstrated the use of several, including safety procedures.

Dennis' presentation on the use of the Seitz Jeweling Tool included a video demonstration and a number of usage tips. Laurie Penman, scheduled

to lead two workshops, was unfortunately ill and too weak to participate. We hope he'll come back another time.

The breakfast attendance was excellent, as was the food. John Hubby represented the



National organization and provided updates on recent events. He encouraged contributions and volunteerism, and talked especially about potential changes to rules for local and regional shows that will encourage new member interest in the NAWCC. And he reminded us of the National Convention in Cleveland on June 21 - 25, pointing out that the previous annual convention in Cleveland still holds the record as the largest show ever.☺

Advanced Clock Repair with Laurie Penman

Laurie is a pre-eminent master clockmaker who has authored a number of books on the subject. It quickly became evident that Laurie really “knew his stuff” and could explain the subject matter clearly and, to say the least, completely. Most of the beginning of the week was spent on escapement issues and design. Later, Laurie

discussed common repair problems, and a couple quite unusual ones, using movements brought in by the students.

and Jeff Asbury were very accommodating in cleaning movements, loaning tools, and working into the evening hours to make up the time spent in the classroom and supporting our students.☺
